There are (at least) two endpoints in every cloud operation, the end user client endpoint and the cloud provider(s). To make the cloud a viable solution for your most important data, you will need to tie the security controls you place on these endpoints into one integrated system which we call a TrustedService.

Key items are:

- _IT Managed client endpoints
- _Application Encryption at the Cloud Provider
- _BYoK to the cloud provider (Bring your own (encryption) key)
- _Cloud Provider Guard rails and Governance

We will close off by pulling together all those key items into one consumable solution for your end users, which we call Federated device posture.
